Mid Year Landfall COA Round Up

We are into August already and the year is flying by smoothly. The COA remains in a financially good position to end the year **ahead of budget**. For the **roads and storm drains**, video of the storm drainage piping continues and several repairs have been made to drainage facilities including areas of Pembroke Jones Drive, Bay Colony, Quadrant and Boatswain. We have successfully repaired all **streetlights**. However, streetlight maintenance will continue as LED bulbs burn out and are replaced and wire repairs from contractor damage are repaired.

The replacement of the wood stop signs with reflective DOT standard **stop signs** continues. Please note that due to the overall high traffic volume in our community, most yield signs will be replaced with stop signs.

At the recreation site, a **pickleball court** has been added on the basketball court. If you would like to play, come with your own equipment such as net, racket and balls.

The UNCW student summer intern, Jamie Justice continues her review of the **nature trails**. She has GPS mapped the trails and identified by coordinates the areas of the trail which could use some additional surface stability.

The **safe roads initiative** continues and Chief Adams' article on page 2 provides an update on this program.

For LOS, many thanks to all the owners that contracted with the COA to provide mow, edge and blow lawn maintenance. At almost 300 contracts, we have reached an all time high for this service. The pool cleaning program is off to a good start. Contact Landfall maintenance at maintenance@landfall.org or call Allison or Tina at 256-7604 if you are interested in our **LOS programs** for lawn/landscape bed maintenance, irrigation, handyman services or power washing to name a few.

In conjunction with The Regency, 575' of additional **perimeter fencing** has been added along

the Military Cut off side Landfall border.

Many thanks to the **Landfall Task Force** for the mass e-mail communications about the area surrounding developments seeking Wilmington City Council approval. Fourteen mass e-mails from October 2017 through July 2018 notified our residents of the Planning and City Council meetings. If you did not receive these **e-mails** or the e-mails concerning security updates, storm drain maintenance, weather alerts, power outages, water line flushing, flood map amendments, or notice of neighborhood events, **e-mail coa@landfall.org so that you can receive these messages in the future**.

The **waste removal contract** with Waste Industries has been extended through March of 2020. If you do not participate in recycling, please consider including this option. The additional cost is \$9 per month for every other week. There was no increase in cost of service.

Two projects for later this year include the **over-lay of Pembroke Jones Drive** and the completion of the password protected portion of the **COA website**. There will be more information to follow as these projects are finalized.

Finally, an **owner survey** is in development. The purpose of this survey is to learn about our Landfall residents. It will ask you questions about the neighborhood, your experiences and how you enjoy life in Landfall. We always strive to optimize our facilities, increase the beauty of our environment, maintain safe roads and minimize Landfall's impact on our surrounding waterways. We want to know more about your life and how that fits in with how we work. The survey will be sent out by Survey Monkey and hard copies mailed to owners without e-mail. The survey will be anonymous. Please participate. Security News

VEHICLE SAFETY

Since our safe roads initiative began in March, the amount of monthly citations issued has decreased. There were 122 citations issued in May, and only 89 were issued in the month of June. This is a significant improvement in comparison to the 208 citations that were issued when security first started this program.

Our goal has been to raise awareness of the importance of traffic rules in Landfall and so far, we believe this to be successful. It is our hope that as a community, we can continue to be mindful of our surroundings and follow our traffic rules to aid in the upkeep of our Landfall neighborhood.



PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

Since the beginning of summer and the release of schools, security has had numerous calls regarding bicycle, golf cart, and walker/jogger safety. It is imperative to exercise caution here in Landfall, especially when it concerns the safety of everyone on the road. If you are riding a bike or in-line skating, you must be in a single file line with the flow of traffic. Anyone walking or jogging in Landfall must travel against the flow of traffic and should use sidewalks where available.

STREET LEGAL GOLF CARTS

Golf carts that traverse the roads of Landfall must be plated, registered in NC, and have a Landfall ID sticker. It is import-



ant to know, understand, and follow these rules for the sake of everyone who shares the roads.

We must make conscientious decisions while on our roadways and inform security of any safety issues you may see in your travels. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated. Landfall would not be the prominent community that it is without all of you.

Snapping Turtle Regulations

An annual Wildlife Collection License is needed to take or collect more than 10 per day and 100 per year and no snapping turtle that is less than 11 inches (curved top shell length) may be possessed.

Ongoing Landscape Maintenance

The Landfall Architectural Review Committee reviews and approves new home landscaping, as well as landscape renovations. Maintaining the approved landscape is each homeowner's responsibility, whether done directly by the homeowner, or by a landscape maintenance firm. Unfortunately, there are occasions where compliance slips and landscapes are not kept up to the Landfall standards. We see these properties when we are out walking through our beautiful community where grass clippings are all scattered in the gutter and along the roadside; un-edged lawns allow spiders of turf crawling out toward the road or onto driveways, unpruned (or dead) shrubbery and trees diminish the overall appearance of the neighborhood. We have a 9-10 month growing season in Southeastern North Carolina, and residents new to the area sometimes do not realize how much and how quickly things grow. As a reminder to all homeowners, the following are guidelines available on the COA website:

- Please ensure that you or your landscaper are keeping the landscaping in a neat and orderly manner. The lawn should be regularly mowed and edged. Sweep or blow to clear stray grass clippings from curbs,

walkways and driveways. Clippings and leaves should not be blown into the street or down the storm drains.

- Remove weeds from landscape beds, driveways, and walkways. With some landscape beds, the weeds can be treated with a non-selective, broad spectrum herbicide. Care must be taken to ensure that only the weeds are sprayed. In plant beds with perennials such as hydrangea or ferns or a ground cover, the weeds must be hand pulled. This is time consuming, but necessary.
- For a manicured look, shrubs and bushes must be pruned to proper form. Dead plants should be replaced, and if replacing with a like kind plant, no ARC submittal is necessary. On the other hand, if replacing with new materials, submittal is likely necessary. Please be reminded that altering landscape bed configuration, landscape renovations or replacing lawn areas with landscape beds require submittal to the ARC.

This year the judge for the show is local studio artist Margie Worthington, an acclaimed museum curator who currently

teaches at the Cameron Art Museum.

Former headliners of this event include three-time Grand Slam winner, Tracy Austin; Former US Open, Wimbledon and Davis Cup Champion Stan Smith; nine-time Grand Slam winner Monica Seles; three-time Grand Slam winner and Olympic Gold Medalist Lindsay Davenport and the highest ranked American player in 2006 and Davis Cup Star, James Blake.

Proceeds from the Legends of Tennis go directly to support the Landfall Foundation's grants program, which supports local nonprofits in the areas of the arts, health & welfare and education. Since its inception in 1995, the Foundation has raised and contributed \$4,263,000 to Wilmington nonprofit organizations. In 2017, \$363,100 was awarded to 74 Wilmington area nonprofit organizations.
