Architectural Review Committee News

The Architectural Review Committee remains very busy reviewing new home construction, pools, home additions/ modifications, tree removals, landscape renovations and roof repairs and replacements. For the ARC, hurricane Florence continues to blow. Although a significant portion of the damage to the homes, landscaping and hardscape features such as walls and patios have been repaired, there is still a fair amount of damage evident throughout our community. We still see tarps on some roofs, shingles missing or damaged, and empty landscape beds where trees or large shrubs have come down that may have been covering garage doors or other features of homes. The committee continues to review roof replacements and tree removals as quickly as we receive them.

Contractors and tree removal/landscape companies have been and still are over-scheduled to the extent that it is often difficult to get your repair work done in the near term. Although the ARC cannot recommend specific contractors, we do have a list of builders, designers/architects and landscapers who are currently doing work in Landfall and we would be glad to provide that list to you. Small jobs seem to be the most difficult to get done and builders have been very helpful with assisting in finding subcontractors to help with this work.

Check with the COA maintenance department as they offer handyman services and a complete array of landscape programs including retrofitting plant design within landscape beds where the majority of the plants may have died or are dying or a centerpiece tree was downed or crippled by the hurricane.

With extended daylight and warmer weather approaching here are just a few reminders. The Drysdale gate closes Monday thru Saturday at

 \pm

6:00 pm and is closed all day Sunday to vehicles without barcodes. Also, as you approach the gate, please allow the barrier arms to come down between each vehicle. Once you see the green light

your barcode has been recognized and the gate will function.

Please use caution when walking on the nature trails as with warmer weather comes our "little snake friends." We may see more in those areas because of displacement during the storm and continued wet conditions. Please keep dogs leashed and continue to clean up after your pets.

If you have upcoming events, and need traffic or parking control with traffic cones, please give me a call at 910-256-7651. Also, keep in mind that vehicles are not permitted to park on the street overnight.

Any golf cart that is on the roads of Landfall must be plated and registered in North Carolina.

Please be reminded to follow the speed limits within Landfall. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated and Landfall would not be the prestigious community that it is without all of you. As always, thank you from your security staff!

Those on bicycles or out walking or jogging, remember run/walk/bike in single file.

Remember to bike with flow of traffic and walk or jog against the flow of traffic.

Landfall Rentals and Lease Addendum Reminder

For Landfall Owners who are renting their homes, the COA has a document that may be helpful to you. It is a lease addendum that includes affirmation of Landfall properties subject to the community documents, tenant liability, and reimbursement of landlord by tenant in the event that a fine is levied. HOME AND LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

Spring is a perfect time to survey your home and landscaping for any necessary maintenance. Many thanks to the owners who have already contacted the COA for help with property improvements including removing weeds from landscape beds, fresh mulch applications, weed/fertilization treatments for lawns and home power washing. Please inspect your homesite and note any areas with peeling paint, broken shutters, molded stucco or trim, and discolored walls. Remove and replace any dead landscaping. For bare areas in lawns, please make decisions for how these will be addressed with either new grass or possibly new landscape beds. Please be reminded that any modifications to your home or landscaping must obtain ARC approval. A general spring clean up will be greatly appreciated, prior to the Landfall COA performing our annual (from the street) survey of the entire Landfall community.

Planning your summer vacation?

Do not forget to sign up for our Landfall house checks and security will check your home while you are away. Visit our website at www.landfall.org/security to download and print the form, which can be dropped off at the COA office on Drysdale Drive or at ANY of the gate houses. Having summer guests? Speed things up at the gates by calling in your guests and contractors in advance. Call 910-256-5311 to register.

Address Visibility

Visible addressing may be as simple as trimming back foliage or repainting numbers with contrasting paint colors to make a difference in responders being able to spot numbers at a quick glance. All homeowners are encouraged to view their address numbers from the street at night to make sure that they are still visible.

Number color should be contrasting to the surface on which the numbers are secured. Reflective numbers are most easily seen by first responders. If your home is set back off the street, numbers should be placed near the road, using suggestions above for maximum visibility.

Remember to make your address numbers visible from both sides if emergency services are likely to come from two different directions. Landfall Security, New Hanover County EMS, visitors, food delivery services, UPS, FedEx and your neighbors will appreciate your proactivity in this important matter.
