#### **TRAFFIC RULES**

With summer approaching and the release of schools, please use extreme caution here in Landfall, especially when it concerns the safety of everyone on the road. If you are riding a bike or in-line skating, you must be in a single file line with the flow of traffic. Anyone walking or jogging in Landfall must travel against the flow of traffic and should use sidewalks where available.

#### **GUEST ACCESS**

There will be an increase in visitors, family and friends coming through our gates during the summertime months. Please remember to call in your guests and workers ahead of time if they are not on your guest or service list. If possible, please call in your guests at 910-256-5311 during COA regular office hours which are Monday through Friday 8:00 am to 5:00 pm as this will help alleviate back up at the gates.

#### **HOUSE CHECKS**

Do not forget to sign up for house

checks so we can check on your home while you are away this season. In order to be on house checks, you must fill out our house check form and turn it in to the COA office or to one of our gates on your way out. Please make sure you are filling out the sheet completely and providing us with accurate information and an emergency contact should we need to reach out to you while you are away.

#### **SNAKE AWARENESS**

Just a quick reminder on the topic of summer safety, please be aware that the warm weather brings out more snakes. There have been several sightings and removals so far and there are probably more to come. You can stay safe by being mindful while you are engaging in outdoor activities, especially when doing any kind of gardening or yard work. It is highly encouraged that garage doors are not left open for long periods of time as this creates the perfect opportunity for snakes and other insects/animals to

# **1st Quarter 2019 Finance Committee Report** By Carl Roark, Treasurer

Coming off of the incredible devastation of Hurricane Florence, your COA finished the 2018 year on sound financial footing. Once again, thank you to the entire Landfall community for rallying around, not only our efforts to return our lives to normalcy, but with assisting each other as well.

As the chart to the right shows, we continue to operate on a positive financial footing and to build our financial reserves through the first quarter of 2019.

With over 29 miles of roads, 23 miles of storm drains, 33 retention ponds, 16 buildings, \$1 million in equipment, 2 ½ miles of nature trails, 5 miles of fencing, 720 light posts, 1 earthen dam & 50 landscape lights, the COA is effectively maintaining a small city.

With this in mind, several years ago, the COA prepared a comprehensive **Reserve Study** to serve as our guide for all planned maintenance, replacement and repair expenditures for the Landfall common areas, as well as to build an adequate reserve position. In conjunction with ongoing **robotic evaluation of underground storm drains**, barring more unexpected and unplanned system failures/storm occurrences, we have a clear roadmap/plan to follow to meet the expense to maintain Landfall's common areas in premier condition. We welcome you to visit the COA Office to view the Reserve Study. Simply call to set an appointment with our management team. The next major maintenance project (est. cost \$500,000) begins May 28, weather permitting, with the milling and repaving of Pembroke Jones Drive from Eastwood Road gate to the bridge at Block 46. There will be more announcements on this as the time approaches.

# **Outdoor Living and Architectural Review**

More and more our owners are choosing to extend their living space to the great outdoors with stone firepits, pergolas, outdoor kitchens, cabanas and swimming pools. The design process, including landscaping design, is the key element in ensuring that walls, patios, pool decks, firepits, etc. are an integrated part of the entire site design context. Upright landscape features such as pergolas, cabanas or other accessory structures should be a continuation of the primary building design and located within the setbacks.

Pathways and terraces for outdoor living areas are encouraged, using natural and unobtrusive materials that are enhanced by the planned landscaping materials. Stone steps and mulched paths in a serpentine pattern that minimizes ground disturbance with plantings to provide screening should be included. The design objective is that the outdoor living areas should be within the landscaping and to blend the development into a natural setting rather than contrast or compete with it.

It may be easier to imagine your garden as several different "rooms" in the same way your indoor space is compartmentalized. Imagine what you want for the future as total project and design for the present with that in mind. You may want part of your outdoor living space to be more private than another area. Shrubs or dwarf trees are a softly textured way to accomplish that goal or, perhaps, planted trellis vines are another good screening option.

In order for the ARC to review your plans, the committee needs to know the structure location in relation to the existing

site features, what it will look like and what materials will be used. Therefore, the ARC will need the following for a review of your outdoor living features:

• Modification to existing home form available in the ARC Guidelines with a description of the project.

• A 1"X10' scale site plan showing the home foundation, lot lines, setbacks, spot elevations for existing/finish grade, current landscaping and hardscape features, platted easements (if any), and proposed hardscape and landscape improvements.

• Dimensioned elevation drawings with materials labeled. These drawings should be submitted at  $\frac{1}{4}$  scale.

• Material and color samples.

• The landscape plan must label the location of new landscaping with leader lines to the plant names. Include a plant list

which indicates species of plant, quantity as well as height and width at installation and gallon size.

The Landfall Foundation is pleased to announce the details of their **20th Annual Art Show & Sale**. The show will be held in the newly-renovated **Nicklaus Clubhouse August 15-17**. The event is open to all NC artists and is open to the public. Todd Carignan will be the judge of this year's show. An award-winning and internationallyacclaimed local artist, Todd teaches painting and drawing at the Cameron Art Museum's school and is a member of the Portrait Society of America. On Wednesday, August 14, there will be a juried awards ceremony for best in show and honorable mentions. There will be a preview party for both artists and foundation sponsors that evening by special invitation only. The show will be open August 15-17 from 10:00 am-7:00 pm with a cash bar from 5:00-7:00 pm.

In 2018, the art show exceeded all fundraising expectations by contributing approximately \$31,000 to the Landfall Foundation which was then awarded to various non-profit agencies in the greater Wilmington area funding programs in the Arts, Education, and Health & Welfare grant categories.

Last year, the Landfall Foundation awarded \$388,000 to 82 local non profit organizations, \$50,000 for hurricane relief, \$55,000 in capital grants to improve agency's infrastructure and over \$10,000 in scholarships. Since its inception in 1995, the Landfall Foundation has contributed approximately \$4,700,000 to underfunded non profit organizations in Wilmington.
